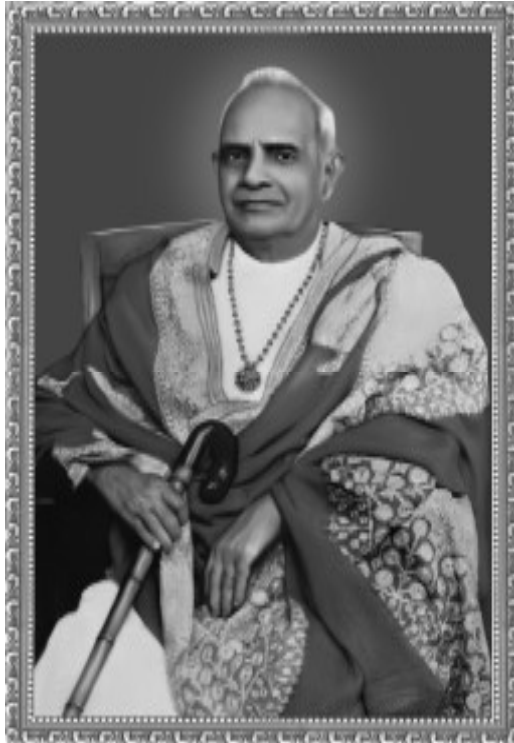

INTRODUCTION

NSS Hindu College, Changanacherry, the earliest among the institutions of higher education was established by the Nair Service Society in 1947. Its history, ever since its inception has been a story of quick growth and steady expansion. The college was first affiliated to the University of Travancore and subsequently to the University of Kerala. With the establishment of Mahatma Gandhi University, the College was affiliated to that University. The college is accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC on 27 th November 2017 .

At its inception the college was housed in the NSS High School building at Perunna. In July 1949 Sri Panampally Govinda Menon, the then Minister for Education, laid the foundation stone of the massive structure which houses the college at present on the extensive piece of land adjoining the NSS Head Quarters. In January 1956 the formal opening of the college building was held with a fortnight long celebrations, inaugurated by Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, the then Vice-President of India and the college building was declared open by Sri. K.M. Munshi, the then Governor of Uttar Pradesh.

At present the college offers 14 Undergraduate courses and 11 Postgraduate Courses and 3 Add-on courses. There are six approved research centres attached to the Depts. of Zoology, Malayalam, Hindi, History, Economics and Mathematics. It is a matter of great pride that the NAAC peer team has observed that the college has great potential to be an autonomous institution.

Administration

Principal, a nominee of the Principal shall preside over the meeting. The council will elect one of its members as the Secretary for a term of one year. The secretary shall give notice of the meeting of the council and keep the minutes of the proceedings.

Working Days and Class Hours

The college works under the full day system with two sessions from 9.30 am to 4.30 p.m. In addition to lecture classes, there will be Seminars, Tutorials., Group Discussion and Counselling. Everyday the classes shall begin with the prayer. When the bell for prayer is heard, all students and members on the staff shall stand up and those who move about in the campus shall stand still in their place till the prayer is over. The session of the day end with National Anthem.

Admission and Withdrawal

1. Students are admitted at the beginning of the first semester of the U.G. Courses.



2. All the merit admission are through M.G. University Centralised process. Application for admission to Community/ Management quota must be made in the prescribed form which can be had from the college office on payment of Rs. 50/-.
3. Candidates seeking admission must produce their original mark list, qualifying certificate, Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate from the school or college they last attended.
4. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examinations from other Board/University should produce a Migration Certificate and Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University.
5. Candidates for admission will be required to appear along with their parents for an interview with the Principal.
6. Candidates selected will have to pay the first instalment of Tuition fees, caution deposit and such other fees prescribed at the college office before they are allowed to attend classes.
7. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be summarily dismissed and shall forfeit whatever fees he/she may have paid.
8. Students belonging to SC/ST/OEC/OBC and KPCR should produce the community/income certificate without which they will not be exempted from payment of fees.
9. Students shall not be given their Transfer Certificate and original qualifying certificates unless he/she pays all fees and other dues to the college.
10. A student applying for the return or release of documents must have cleared all dues to the college.

Rules for General Discipline in the Campus

1. In regard to all matters connected with their conduct, the students of the college are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with the standard of manners and behaviour.
2. Students are not allowed to enter the campus without the IDENTITY CARD, properly worn on the neck.
3. Students shall wear College Uniform on all working days except wednesdays.



4. Students shall attend classes regularly and punctually.
5. When a student meets a member of the teaching/non teaching staff of the college with in the campus or outside, it is a matter of politeness that he/she should greet him/her.
6. When a teacher enters the class, the students must keep standing until the teacher directs them to sit down or he/himself/she/herself occupies his/her seat.
7. Smoking, and Chewing pan are strictly prohibited within the college premises.
8. Students are prohibited from making complaints in a body and, addressing the authority collectively. But they may make representations individually to the Principal.
9. Irregular attendance, insubordination or insolent conduct to teachers or other members of the staff, habitual inattention to class work, obscenity in word or deed are sufficient reasons for disciplinary action against a student.
10. Any student suspended from the college shall not come to the college premises during the period of suspension.
11. Political activities are prohibited in the college campus.
12. The students shall not organize or attend meetings other than the official ones in the college campus.
13. Students should take note of the departmental and other notification displayed on the notice board, every day before they leave the college. Failure to look at the Notice Board will not be an excuse for omission or commission.
14. Students are forbidden from making any mark on the furniture, on the walls or any part of the college premises.
15. Any damage to the college property will have to be made good.
16. No notice or appeal of any kind shall be circulated among the students or pasted on the notice board or any where within the college premises.
17. Students are forbidden from bringing MOBILE PHONE in to the campus.



18. It shall be competent for the Principal to expel any student of the college for reasons to be recorded in writing and intimated to the parent or guardian.
19. An adverse entry on the conduct of a student in the confidential register may debar him/her from receiving a certificate of good conduct and character from the Principal.
20. Ragging is prohibited by law. Students shall not indulge in any such activities.

Attendance

1. The academic year 2017- 2018 consists of 2 terms which will begin and end as follows
Odd Semesters 1-6-2018 to 31-10-2018
Even Semesters 13-11-2018 to 29-3-2019
The probable number of working days for the year will be 196.
2. Student attendance management is done online through NSS HC NET ERP system.
3. On every working day the attendance of the student for every hour is uploaded by the teacher in the time table.
4. Promotion to the senior classes & presentation to university examination shall be subject to the following conditions.
 - a) The student should have earned at least three fourth of attendance prescribed by the college for the course during the semester.
 - b) He/she should have completed the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the college authorities and his/her progress, conduct and character should have been satisfactory.
5. Students seeking exemption from the rules relating to minimum attendance shall apply for exemption to the university, through the Principal before the due date. Every application for exemption shall be made in the prescribed form accompanied by a chalan receipt for Rs.1000/- Rs.1500/- depending on the number of days for which exemption is sought. The reason for absence has to be explained. In the case of absence on account of illness medical certificate has also to be furnished. No exemption will be granted to the same student for more than one semester in a course.



6. Absence without leave letter will not be considered under any circumstances.

Attendance and leave of absence

1. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each hour.
2. Students shall not be allowed to leave their class rooms without the permission of the teacher. Late comers shall not enter the class without the permission of the teacher. Serious action will be taken against repeated late coming.
3. During authorised free hours students should make use of the available facilities in the reading rooms or remain silent and work in their halls.
4. Students are not permitted to absent themselves from class without leave. Leave application should be submitted to the Principal in advance in the prescribed form.
5. Absence without leave, from class, for a period in a session (FN or AN) will be considered absence for half day.
6. Application for leave should be recommended by the Lecturer in charge of the group in the prescribed form appended. .
7. Applications for leave on grounds of illness shall be supported by a medical certificate.
8. A student absenting himself/herself from college, with or without leave for more than five consecutive working days shall report to the Principal before attending any class.
9. A student absenting himself/herself from college for fifteen consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to have his/her name removed from the rolls.
10. In the case of absence from any test paper or composition exercise the paper or exercise missed must be answered and the answer paper or book should be submitted to the teacher concerned before the student is admitted to the next class. Failure to do so will entail disciplinary action.
11. A monthly statement of attendance earned by the students will be published on the notice board of the concerned departments. Students shall examine the lists and report to the Tutor/Head of the



Dept, if any discrepancy is noticed.

12. Students who do not have the prescribed minimum attendance without proper reason will not be allowed to appear for the University Examinations.

College Examinations.

Examinations will be held at least twice during an academic year.

In addition to this, test papers in all subjects will be held by the Heads of the Departments. Serious action will be taken against those who fail to take the examination/test papers without sufficient grounds. Progress report will be sent to the guardians of the students after the examinations. External examination is done through Online Question Secured System of Mahatma Gandhi University.

- E. The College has been implemented open source Hybrid Solution of KOHA – (LMS) with CampusNET ERP Library e-Gate (Attendance), Library Information KIOSK (Touch Screen) and CampusNET ERP Digital Library.

a. CampusNET ERP Library e-Gate

The e-gate helps to record the entry and exit of the members in the library. It will give detailed reports to plan for the better usage of the library by the members.

b. CampusNET ERP Library Information KIOSK

The entire Library related information can be availed through this touch screen unit. Book search, journal, periodicals, CD collections,



bound journals, renewal or reservation of issued books, etc..are integrated with this KIOSK machine. Security checking with smart card is integrated with the unit. Library Information KIOSK machine displays the top ten library used/issued books with cover page and members with photo, name and count of books taken. KIOSK machine displays the new arrival list while the machine is not in use.

c. CampusNET ERP Digital Library

Huge data base can be accessed from the college intranet in a digital form Information from the main server is available in all the departments of the college in different digital format such as pdf, doc, html, images, video and many more. These documents can be accessed under the seven major areas :- e-Books, College Library, Google Books, Multimedia Library, Teachers Collection and CD Collections.

Library follows AACR-2 for cataloguing documents.

E. Services and facilities within the library

1. Lending of Books / Documents

i) General Books

Four books are issued to Post-Graduate students at a time, one book for under graduate students, five books for Research scholars and fifteen books for faculty members. Books should be returned on or before due date and there exists a provision for renewal of Books.

ii) Reference Books

Reference books are kept for the use of students and staff to refer within the Reference Section.

2. Lending of Periodicals

Periodicals and newspapers are available in the reading rooms. Two reading rooms have been provided in the campus.



3. Internet

Internet is provided in the library. Students and staff can make use of this facility to browse and get access to the enormous www. Resources.

F. Rules and Regulations

1. The library will be opened from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on all working days and there shall be a 30 minutes break between 12.30 to 1 p.m.
2. Students should produce the Smart ID card to borrow books.
3. Books borrowed by the borrowers shall not be retained for more than 14 days from the date of issue. If the due date falls on a holiday the book must be returned on the next working day. Books borrowed before the commencement of vacation must be returned not later than the third working day after the re-opening of the college.
4. The transfer or sub-lending of books is strictly prohibited.
5. Any book may be recalled at any time even if the period of loan has not expired.
6. Failure to return the book on the due date entails a fine of Re. 1 per day of delay of each books.
7. Failure to pay Library fine due or failure to return the books within the due date by a student entails loss of privilege to borrow more books from the library till the overdue books are returned and dues cleared.
8. The marking on books with ink or pencil, spoiling or damaging, underlining of passages, writing or remarks etc. on the leaves of books or on illustration, tearing of pages, pictures, removal of accompanying CD etc. are punishable.
9. If any book is lost, damaged or mutilated, the borrower would be required to replace the book with fine or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the principal.
10. If a book belonging to a set or series is lost / damaged and a new volume is not available, the borrower shall be required to replace the whole set or series.



11. Before leaving the counter, borrower shall examine the books taken by them and point out any mutilation or defect in any books, to the concerned staff and these defects etc. have to be noted in the Register provided for the purpose and initialed by him/her. Otherwise the borrower will be held responsible for any damage or mutilation observed.
12. It shall be the duty of the librarian and his staff to examine the books returned by the borrowers and take immediate action in all cases of mutilation or damage.
13. Strict discipline and silence should have to be maintained by all the users in the Library.

G. Reading Rooms

1. The students and staff can make use of the facilities provided in the reading rooms during the working time.
2. The news papers and periodicals etc. lying on the table shall not be removed from the reading rooms or from the place allotted for each.
3. Loud reading or talking in the reading room is strictly forbidden.
4. Any loss or damage will have to be paid for, by the person responsible for it.
5. Umbrellas, hand bags and other personal belongings including books must be kept in the property counter before entering the Library / Reading rooms.
6. Students should leave the reading rooms five minutes before the closing time.

Computer laboratory

A computer laboratory is set up in the college fully equipped with state-of-the-art computer systems. The laboratory can be made use of by the students and staff. Computer literacy programmes for staff and students and various IT courses are offered. Internet is provided in the Computer Lab. The Computer Lab is linked with the Digital Library through LAN by which the students can access catalog and E-learning resources.

English Language Lab

A full fledged English Language Lab with a seating capacity of ten students (10 + 1 system) and equipped with the latest language



software functions in the college with the aim of enabling students to develop communication skills. The lab equipped with internet facilities. So as to enable the students to avail NPTEL online courses.

For fast internet connection the college relies on dedicated optical fiber connection of the BSNL. All the departments have LAN with internet facilities.

The department of Commerce, Chemistry, Zoology, Physics have virtual class rooms. This enable students and faculties to participate in remote learning communities using personal computers. We use both online and offline resources in teaching learning process.

Fitness Centre

The centre is well equipped with a cable cross over . High lat rowing machine Thigh curl and extension, Shoulder Press, Parallel Bars, squat rack, multipurpose bench, rubberised weight training set, adjustable dumbbell, manual treadmill, push up stand etc Teachers and students may utilize the centre from 2.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. on all week days.

Health and Hygiene

**UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMME - CBCSS****1 ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

Eligibility of admission. Norms for admission, reservation of seats for various degree Programmes shall be according to the rule framed by the university from time to time.

2 DURATION

The duration of UG programmes shall be 6 semesters.

The duration of each semester shall be 90 working days. Odd semesters from June to October and even semesters from November to March.

A student may be permitted to complete the programme, on valid reasons, within a period of 12 continuous semesters from the date of commencement of the first semester of the programme.

3 REGISTRATION

The strength of students for each course shall remain as per existing regulations, except in case of open courses for which there shall be a minimum of 15 and maximum of 75 students per batch, subject to a marginal increase of 10.

Each student shall register for the course in the prescribed registration form in consultation with the faculty Advisor within two weeks from the commencement of each semester. Faculty Advisor shall permit registration on the basis of the preferences of the student and availability of seats.

The number of courses/Credits that a student can take in a semester is governed by the provisions in these regulations pertaining to the minimum and maximum number of credits permitted.

A student can opt out of a course/courses registered subject to the minimum credits requirements within thirty days from the commencement of the semester.

The college shall send a list of students registered for each programme in each semester giving the details of courses registered



including repeat courses to the university in the prescribed form within 45 days from the commencement of the Semester.

4 SCHEME AND SYLLABUS

The U.G. programmes shall include (a) Common courses I & II, (b) Core courses, (c) Complementary Courses, (d) Open Course.

Credit Transfer and Accumulation system can be adopted in the programme. Transfer of Credit consists of acknowledging, recognizing and accepting credits by an institution for programmes or courses completed at another institution. The Credit Transfer Scheme shall allow students pursuing a programme in one University to continue their education in another University without break.

5 PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

There shall be a maximum of three credits for the open course and remaining one credit should be shifted to choice based course or any other core course.

6 EXAMINATION

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts:

- (i) Internal or In-Semester Assessment (ISA)
- (ii) External or End-Semester Assessment (ESA)

The internal to external assessment ratio shall be 1:4, for both courses



with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for external evaluation and maximum of **20** marks for internal evaluation. For all courses (theory & practical), grades are given on a 07-point scale based on the total percentage of marks. **(ISA+ESA)** as given below

11 ASSIGNMENTS

Assignments are to be done from 1st to 4th Semesters. At least one assignment should be done in each semester.

12. SEMINAR/VIVA

A student shall present a seminar in the 5th semester and appear for Viva-voce in the 6th semester.

13. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT TEST PAPERS

At least one internal test-paper is to be attended in each semester for each course. The evaluations of all components are to be published



and are to be acknowledged by the candidates. All documents of internal assessments are to be kept in the college for two years and shall be made available for verification by the University. The responsibility of evaluating the internal assessment is vested on the teacher(s), who teach the course.

14. Grievance Redressal Mechanism

Internal assessment shall not be used as a tool for personal or other type of vengeance. A student has all rights to know, how the teacher arrived at the marks. In order to address the grievance of students a three-level Grievance Redressal mechanism is envisaged. A student can approach the upper level only if grievance is not addressed at the lower level.

Level 1: Dept. Level: The department cell chaired by the Head; and Dept. coordinator and teacher in-charge, as members.

Level 2: College level: A committee with the Principal as Chairman, Dept. Coordinator, HOD of concerned Department and a senior teacher nominated by the College council as members.

Level 3: University Level: A Committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor as Chairman and Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Convener - Syndicate sub-committee on Students Discipline and Welfare, Chairman- Board of Examinations as members and the Controller of Examination as member-secretary.

The college council shall nominate a senior teacher as coordinator of internal evaluations. This coordinator shall make arrangements for giving awareness of the internal evaluation components to students immediately after commencement of I semester

The internal evaluation report in the prescribed format should reach the University before the 4th week of October and March in every academic year.

15. External examination

The external examination of all semesters shall be conducted by the University at the end of each semester.



POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME- CSS

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

1. Students shall be admitted into post graduate programme under the faculties.
2. The programme shall include two types of courses, Program Core (PC) courses and Program Elective (PE) Courses . There shall be a Program Project (PP) with dissertation to be undertaken by all students. The Programme will also include assignments, seminars / practical viva etc. if they are specified in the Curriculum.
3. There shall be various groups of Programme Elective courses for a programme such as Group A, Group B etc. for the choice of students subject to the availability of facility and infrastructure in the institution and the selected group shall be the subject of specialization of the programme.

Project work

1. Project work shall be completed by working outside the regular teaching hours .
2. Project work shall be carried out under the supervision of a teacher in the concerned department .
3. A candidate may, however, in certain cases be permitted to work on the project in an industrial / Research Organization on the recommendation of the Supervisor.
4. There should be an internal assessment and external assessment for the project work.
5. The external evaluation of the Project work is followed by presentation of work including dissertation and Viva-Voce.
6. The title and the credit with grade awarded for the program project should be entered in the grade card issued by the university.
7. Assignments: Every student shall submit one assignment as an internal component for every course with a weightage one. The Topic for the assignment shall be allotted within the 6th week of instruction.

Seminar Lectures

1. Seminar Lecture: Every PG student shall deliver one seminar lecture as an internal component for every course with a weightage two. The



seminar lecture is expected to train the student in self-study, collection of relevant matter from the books and Internet resources, editing, document writing, typing and presentation.

2. Every student shall undergo at least two class tests as an internal component for every course with a weightage one each. The weighted average shall be taken for awarding the grade for class tests.

3. The attendance of students for each course shall be another component of internal assessment as prescribed with weightage one. No course shall have more than 4 credits.

4. Comprehensive Viva-voce shall be conducted at the end semester of the program comprehensive Viva-Voce covers questions from all courses in the programme.

ATTENDANCE

1. The minimum requirement of aggregate attendance during a semester for appearing the end semester examination shall be 75%. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of post graduate programme may be granted by the University.

2. If a student represents his/her institution, University, State or Nation in Sports, NCC, NSS or Cultural or any other officially sponsored activities such as college union / university union activities, he/she shall be eligible to claim the attendance for the actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 10 days in a Semester based on the specific recommendations of the Head of the Department and Principal of the College concerned.

3. A student who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance shall not be permitted to take the end Semester examinations.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Candidates for admission to the first semester of the PG programme through CSS shall be required to have passed an appropriate Degree Examination of Mahatma Gandhi University as specified or any other examination of any recognized University or authority accepted by the Academic council of Mahatma Gandhi University as equivalent thereto.

2. The candidate must forward the enrollment form to the Controller of Examinations of the University through the Head of the Institution, in which he / she is currently studying.



3.The candidate has to register all the courses prescribed for the particular semester. Cancellation of registration is applicable only when the request is made within two weeks from the time of admission.

4. Students admitted under this programme are governed by the Regulations in force.

PROMOTION

A student who registers for the end semester examination shall be promoted to the next semester

EXAMINATIONS

1.There shall be University examination at the end of each semester.

2.Practical examinations shall be conducted by the University at the end of each semester.

3.Project evaluation and Viva -Voce shall be conducted at the end of the programme only. Practical examination, Project evaluation and Viva-Voce shall be conducted by two external examiners and one internal examiner.

4.End-Semester Examinations: The examinations shall normally at the end of each semester.

5.There shall be one end-semester examination of 3 hours duration in each lecture based course and practical course.

EVALUATION AND GRADING

1.Evaluation: The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts; (a) internal evaluation and (b) external evaluation. 25% weightage shall be given to internal evaluation and the remaining 75% to external evaluation and the ratio and weightage between internal and external is 1:3. Both internal and external evaluation shall be carried out using Direct grading system.

2.Internal evaluation: The internal evaluation shall be based on predetermined transparent system involving periodic written tests, assignments, seminars and attendance in respect of theory courses and based on written tests, lab skill/records/viva and attendance in respect of practical courses. The weightage assigned to various components for internal evaluation is as follows.

To ensure transparency of the evaluation process, the internal assessment grade awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be published on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of external examination. There shall not be any chance for improvement for internal grade.

Each course is evaluated by assigning a letter grade (A, B, C, D or E) to that course by the method of direct grading. The internal (weightage =1) and external weightage =3) components of a course are separately graded and then combined to get the grade of the course after taking into account of their weightage.

A separate minimum of C grade is required for a pass for both internal evaluation and external evaluation for every course.
